ABOUT THE PARK

- There are **21 points of entry**.
- **The Williams Lodge** serves as the main park house, including the Welcome Center.
- **The park opens daily** at 9 a.m. and will close at 10 p.m. April 1-Oct. 31 and 9 p.m. Nov. 1-March 31.
- There will be **24-hour on-site security**. In addition, there will be security cameras and lighting throughout the site, including motion sensors in the parking lot and gates that close off public access after-hours.
- The park will offer **diverse culinary offerings**, all at an affordable price. The Vista at The Boathouse is the formal sit-down restaurant, while The Patio at The Lodge offers walk-up grab-and-go options with outdoor patio seating. The Red Bud Café offers coffee, gelato and candy.
- There are **two sensory rooms** in the park: one behind Williams Lodge help desk and one in the Chapman Adventure Playground restroom area. The sensory rooms are designed to offer a calming environment for children with autism.
- **The Williams Lodge** is home to a giant oval-shaped stone two-story fireplace.
- **Mist Mountain** features leaping jets of water and mist areas with waterfalls.
- **The Water Maze**, located south of Mist Mountain, shoots water almost 7 feet in the air.
- Gathering Place uses its own wildflower mix designed by **Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Foundation** in Austin, Texas.
- The historic **Midland Valley Trail**, named after the abandoned rail corridor once used by the Midland Railroad, passes through Gathering Place and connects Tulsa's downtown with the riverfront.
